About the Board

The Ngarimu VC & 28th (Māori) Memorial Scholarship Fund was established after World War II to commemorate the services of the 28th Māori Battalion, and Second Lieutenant Te Moananui a Kiwa Ngārimu, the first Māori to receive the Victoria Cross. The Ngarimu VC & 28th (Māori) Battalion Memorial Scholarship Fund Board is responsible for administering the Fund for the purpose of granting assistance to Māori in education, promoting the study and use of Te Reo, and of Māori history, tradition and culture.

The Board currently provides assistance to Māori students through the annual provision of tertiary education and vocational education and training scholarships. The Board also offers the Manakura Award to honour excellence in educational endeavour and the Ngarimu Video Competition, targeted at students in Years 7–13. The Board has the responsibility of granting permission to use the name and or emblem of the 28th Māori Battalion. Members are expected to attend three meetings a year (March, July and October) in Wellington where possible, and attend additional scholarship panels as needed.
