The Panel is seeking applications from researchers interested projects which improve health outcomes of New Zealand veterans.

Types of research that can be funded

Research can be funded if it investigates a field of medicine that may benefit NZ veterans. When the Panel releases a call for research proposals it will identify the type of research it is interested in funding.

Seeking funding

How to apply for funding

The application process has two stages:

- Project inquiry. The Panel will advise when it is seeking applications from NZ-based researchers.

- 2. **Project Proposal.** If the Panel agrees your project should be pursued, it will invite you to submit a full project proposal.

Decisions on these are made by the Fahel.

How much is awarded

Levels of funding will be advised when the Panel releases a call for research proposals. The use of co-funding for costly or complex projects is encouraged.
